## PASTORAL LETTER FROM THE RECTOR, THE REVD STEPHEN EARL

### **'Thy Kingdom Come': Thursday 30 May – Sunday 9 June**

Dear Friends,

Words from the Lord's Prayer '**Thy Kingdom Come**' have become the strap-line for the Church's prayer focus for each other and for the world especially over the period between the two great post-Easter festivals of the Ascension and Pentecost.

After the very first Ascension Day, the disciples gathered with Mary, the mother of our Lord, constantly devoting themselves to prayer while they awaited the outpouring of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost. Like them, our reliance on the gift of the Holy Spirit is total – for on our own we can do nothing. Which is why, through the centuries, Christians have gathered at this time to pray for the coming of the Holy Spirit.

Great hymns such as 'Come Holy Ghost our souls inspire', 'Spirit of the Living God fall afresh on me', 'Come down O Love divine', 'Spirit of God unseen as the wind' all inspire our prayers and worship at this time.

The Church's '**Thy Kingdom Come**' initiative picks up this long-established tradition and gives it a special focus. Over the past three years, more and more worshipping communities have made this a time to pray with passion '*Come, Holy Spirit*' – that the Spirit of God may inspire and equip us to share the love of Christ, and the Good News he brings, with our friends, families, communities and networks. Each year it has been amazing the many varied ways people have taken up this challenge, and the effects have been remarkable.

As across the country and among churches of all traditions, the parishes of Lavenham and Preston St Mary are this year once again asking everyone to join in praying for the renewing and empowering of the Holy Spirit. It is our prayer that those who have not yet heard the Good News of Jesus Christ and his love for the world, or who have heard and have not yet responded, will take this to heart themselves and follow Him. Specifically, we invite every Christian to pray that God's Spirit might work in the lives of five friends, maybe family, maybe others, who have not yet responded with their own personal 'Yes' to God's call.

Supporting this initiative, on each of the days from Thursday 30<sup>th</sup> May to Sunday 9<sup>th</sup> June inclusive, there will be a chance to gather with others in Lavenham Church to pray for the Holy Spirit's outpouring in God's world and among his people, including opportunities for lighting candles in the Lady Chapel for individuals on our hearts and for world situations.

We do hope you will join us for whatever time you can spare – even if just on one of these occasions! The prayer times and church services for the period are set out on the following page.

**love, joy, peace,  
patience, kindness, goodness,  
faithfulness, gentleness and self-control.**

## **Thy Kingdom Come** **Thursday 30 May to Sunday 9 June**

Many people are only prompted to explore the Christian faith when someone cares enough about them to pray for them or to share their own faith with them.

During the 10-day period from Ascension Day (30 May) to Pentecost Sunday (9 June) we are inviting all Christians to pray for five friends, maybe family, maybe others, who have not yet responded with their own personal 'Yes' to God's call.

We hope that many in our community will, in their own homes, choose to pray at 9:00am each day knowing that others are also choosing to pray for their friends at exactly the same time.

We are also planning a number of events within the church. These include:

- 5 minutes of led prayers and readings at 11:00am each day (not Sundays);
- Parish Communion at 10:00am on Thursday 30 May (Ascension Day)
- Morning Worship (no communion) at 10:15am on Sunday 2 June;
- Parish Communion at 10:15am on Sunday 9 June (Pentecost Sunday)

This short, 10-day period between Ascension Day and Pentecost is an ideal time in which to consider matters of faith.

If you are able, please come along to one of our services or other events.

Unless a service or other event is taking place, our Lady Chapel is usually available for prayer and quiet reflection each day between 8:30am and 6:00pm.

### **Bishops' Lent Appeal - Bwana Asifiwe! Praise the Lord!**

## **Strawberry Tea at Hatherley Cottage**



### From Preston St Mary's new Tree Warden

I have been the Tree Warden for the village for about six months and although I'm sure many people in the village know more about trees than I do, I am very enthusiastic to learn!

I have a passion for our beautiful Suffolk countryside and am hoping to contribute towards preserving the trees we have, particularly the ancient and veteran ones, and also to encourage the planting of new trees. I have begun the process of identifying and recording the positions of our ancient trees, which is important to monitor their condition and ensure their preservation. I would be grateful if villagers who know of any could let me know.

I am sadly aware of the impact of Ash Dieback on our village Ash trees and hope that eventually these trees will be replaced by similar species and resistant forms of the Ash.

Last year the Woodland Trust offered free packs of fifty sapling trees with guards and stakes for people to plant on their land and I'm glad to say I managed to find homes for 100.

I have just received information that trees are available again this year. The trees are cell-grown, 20-40cm UK sourced and grown saplings. Each pack of 50 comprises 10 Oak, 10 Hornbeam, 10 Field Maple and 10 Small Leaved Lime plus 2 x 5 trees with a choice from Beech, Aspen, Silver Birch, Crab Apple, Wild Cherry or Wild Service tree.

I can order 1, 2 or 3 packs for planting in the village. They will be delivered or can be collected in November and need to be planted by February 2020.

Please contact me if you think you have space for a pack or part of a pack.

We have some beautiful trees on the village green, and I am keeping an eye on their health and condition. The Parish Council are in the process of having work completed where necessary to remove, replace and maintain these. If anyone has concerns about any tree do feel free to speak to me. I am aware that a Cherry tree is dying and that a small Ash is dead.

The Suffolk Local History Council runs a Recorders Scheme throughout Suffolk. We administer a network of volunteers to ensure that the '*present*' is adequately recorded at local level for the '*future*'.

A Recorder will note significant happenings in their parish and collect their local parish magazines, leaflets, election pamphlets and newspaper cuttings. At the end of each year, they are asked to submit a short report summarising the activities of their parish. The reports are deposited at the Suffolk Record Office and available to future researchers together with the collected items.

You do not need to be a historian; you do not need any qualifications other than an interest in your parish. ## HISTORY NOTES

### D-DAY 75

#### Vintage 1940's Commemorative Weekend in Lavenham

17th – 19th May 2019

FRIENDS OF

THE 487TH BG, 8TH USAAF



American military vehicles from WW2 filled Lavenham's Market Place during the weekend of 18<sup>th</sup>/19<sup>th</sup> May. Wreaths were laid at the 487<sup>th</sup> BG memorial, and a convoy of 40 Jeeps and trucks paraded through the village to the Airfield, which was open to the public. American visitors who joined us for the weekend included two veterans of the 487<sup>th</sup> BG who had served here in 1944-45.

This year we are commemorating the 75<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of D-Day, the Allied invasion of Nazi-held Europe, which took place on 6<sup>th</sup> June 1944. In the weeks and months preceding the Normandy landings there was assembled in Britain an enormous force of personnel, vehicles, equipment and materiel in preparation for launching and sustaining the operation, codenamed Overlord and combining British, American, Canadian and other Commonwealth and Allied forces.

East Anglia, in common with most of the Southern half of the country, was blanketed with temporary camps and vehicle parks, including the Kentwell Hall estate in Long Melford, which was a temporary infantry transit camp. During late May and early June 1944, the sound of tanks and heavy military vehicles could be heard night and day as units headed for the south coast to embark, adding to the noise of thousands of B17 and B24 bombers.

Overlord was the largest military operation in history, D-Day alone involving 7,000 ships, over 10,000 aircraft, 150,000 men, 500,000 tons of ammunition and 7 million tons of supplies.

This area was especially important as the home of The United States 8<sup>th</sup> Air Force, which flew daily missions with up to 2000 aircraft in the air at once, attacking communications and transport targets in France, Belgium and Germany in order to prevent Hitler from sending reinforcements to Northern France.

On 20<sup>th</sup> May 1944 a USAAF Liberator took off from Sudbury on a bombing mission to the Liège railway marshalling yards in Belgium. Immediately, an engine failed and, trying to gain height, the aircraft hit some trees, stopping another engine. It crashed at Rise Farm, Preston St Mary, and three of the ten crew died. Their names are remembered on Remembrance Sunday each year in Preston Parish Church. Preston Wine Club visited the site on 21<sup>st</sup> May this year and observed a minute's silence to commemorate those who died. Research into the incident was provided by Geoff Poole.

### HORTICULTURAL NOTES

#### Cover up

A neighbour recently asked me how they could disguise an unattractive fence, so here are a few of my favourite fast growing climbers;

Clematis Montana is a gorgeous and fast-growing early flowerer that grows well in nearly any position, providing a stunning display of blooms in mid to late spring.

Honeysuckle, a personal favourite, with gorgeous scented flowers of varying shades. Evergreen or deciduous, there are many varieties to choose from. This rapid climber will do a sterling job of rapidly disguising an unattractive area of your garden.

Humulus Lupulus 'Aurea' (Golden Hop) is a wonderful strong growing perennial vine with lime green leaves and beautiful papery, cone like fruits in late summer.

This lovely plant dies back in winter but comes back year after year. Hops need a good support and are ideal plant for cottage or Mediterranean style gardens as they thrive in a south or west facing site. An added bonus is that you can dry the branches and fruits and use them for beautiful seasonal decorations in your home.

Finally, Parthenocissus Quinquefolia, (Virginia Creeper), a vigorous semi-evergreen climber that will grow in most positions, including shade, providing lush green foliage throughout the spring and summer and a stunning display of scarlet foliage come the Autumn.

### **The Pumilio Child** by Judith McInerney

The Pumilio Child is an extraordinary story of a young girl's resilience to danger, cruelty and hardship. In weaving her story through two very different cultures in 15<sup>th</sup> Century China and Venice the author enables us to glimpse those far off times with intriguing tales of a practice seldom or never heard of. Pumilio is a word I found hard to grasp before I finished reading the book, but I cannot forget it now. The story is full of suspense, male aggression and ambition and female subtlety. In spite of her faults you want our heroine to succeed. A very readable book from the onset. Could not put it down. Well done Judith McInerney for such a brilliant historical novel. ### Cabbage de Luxe

Turn boring old cabbage into something luxurious (well almost!). It's not often you see the words cabbage and luxurious in the same sentence!

Skill needed – hardly any, provided you can cook cabbage and make a sauce. It's easy peasy.....

Amounts depend on how many you are cooking for, but you will need:

A quantity of cooked white cabbage  
A quantity of white sauce, seasoned to taste  
Breadcrumbs  
An ovenproof dish

Simply mix the cabbage and white sauce. There should be enough sauce to coat the cabbage really well. Put the mixture into an oven proof dish and cover with breadcrumbs. For best results use Panko breadcrumbs. Drizzle the top with a little olive oil and oven cook until the top is golden and crispy.

Et Voilà! Posh cabbage!

## AGRICULTURE NOTES

In our rural idyll it is easy to forget we are surrounded by industry – and an industry in a constant state of uncertainty and dependence on the weather. Gary Elsdon says this Spring has been so much better than last Spring and they have drilled for barley, sugar beet and maize. However, there is currently a slight drought and land drains have not gushed for some time. 28mm of rain in early May was “a godsend”. Last harvest’s grain is now being delivered and will be tested for protein content. If this is high enough it will be used for brewing or milling. If not, it will be animal feed! JT
